Steve Smith marked his return to international cricket in imperious fashion with a third hundred of the Ashes series on Thursday as Australia put themselves in a dominant position in the fourth Test.

Smith was 173 not out in Australia's commanding 369-5 at tea on the second day of the match against England at Old Trafford.

It was his highest score of a series during which Smith's lowest total in four innings is 92. This was also the eighth time he had passed 150 in a

in Leeds remain intact.

And with Australia left-arm fast bowler Mitchell Starc looking to make a mark in his first Test of the series, England faced a tough task just to get back on level terms in Manchester.

But it might have been a different story had fast bowler Jofra Archer held on to a Smith caught-and-bowled chance. Archer, whose bouncer at Lord's concussed Smith and ruled him out of the Headingley match, dropped the world's number one-ranked Test batsman on 65.

Smith was given another reprieve on 118 when he edged Jack Leach to Ben Stokes at slip only for replays to reveal the left-arm spinner had overstepped for a no-ball – a careless error for a slow bowler.

Smith's innings followed his scores of 144 and 142 in Australia's 251-run win in the opener at Edgbaston – his first Test since completing a 12-month ball-tampering ban – and the

left-hander this series when a full-length delivery had Travis Head lbw for 19.

Leach, who had played a key supporting role at No 11 while all-rounder Stokes's superb 135 not out saw England to victory at Headingley, lured Matthew Wade (16) into a miscued drive to England captain Joe Root at mid-on.

Smith then clipped Craig Overton for a two through square leg that saw him to his 26th Test century in 160 balls, with 11 fours.
